BRIDGE NEAR CROOKSTON IS CARRIED AWAY

Red Lake River Continues to Rise—Many Places Flooded.

(Herald Special Service.)—The Red Lake river is steadily rising, and gained nearly a foot since last night. The ice this morning carried away the new steel bridge over the river between here and Crookston, and the old bridge, a mile farther down, is doomed.

SENATE AMENDS ARMY MEASURE

Strengthen Federalization of Guard by Requiring Oath to Obey President.

Washington, April 15.—To further strengthen the federalization of the National Guard, the senate by a vote of 38 to 23, amended the army reorganization bill to require guardsmen to take an oath to obey the orders of the president, as well as of the governor of their state.

ADMINISTRATION IS ATTACKED

Rep. Rodenberg Would Prevent Shipment of Arms into Mexico.

Washington, April 15.—Representative Rodenberg, republican of Illinois, introduced a resolution prohibiting the shipment of arms and munitions of war into Mexico. It was not discussed, and Rodenberg later issued a statement criticizing the Wilson administration, saying that Carranza had given abundant evidence of his treacherous character.
