TURKS CRUSHED SAY RUSSIANS

Fall of Trebizond Gives Rise to More Rumors of Peace.

Petrograd, via London, April 21.—The fall of Trebizond has given rise to a fresh crop of rumors that Turkey is approaching Russia with peace overtures, but it is authoritatively stated in official circles that no such proposals will be considered for a moment by the Russian government.

Voicing a conviction that Turkey is a defeated nation and not in a position to make any terms, the Petrograd Gazette declares:

"We may now consider one of our enemies crushed. The taking of Trebizond has so disorganized the Turkish defensive plans that all that remains for her to lay down her arms and ask for separate peace has sought ways to a separate peace, but has met with the absolute refusal of her opponent, who is determined to close no separate agreements. Turkey's hour has struck and it is not improbable that she will in the near future entirely disappear from the map."

It is longer impeded by Turkish pressure on the coast, the Russian armies of Erzerum have begun a swift advance on Rairuz and Erzincan. With the Russian groups of Russian armies from the Black sea coast to Bitlis in close co-operation, the westward campaign through Asia Minor is expected to develop rapidly.

OCEAN INSURANCE RATES REDUCED

Washington, April 21.—Reductions in ocean insurance rates generally, and an increase in rates on cargoes to far eastern ports routed through the Suez canal, were announced by the government war risk bureau.

Between United States ports and belligerent ports of western Europe are lowered from 25 cents on the \$100 to 15 cents; between the United States and belligerent ports of eastern Europe from 25 cents to 15 cents; between belligerent ports in the western hemisphere from 12-1/2 cents to 5 cents.

Rates to the east through Suez are raised from 50 cents on the \$100 to \$1 on the hundred.

QUAKER OATS COMPANY WINS

Not Violating Sherman Anti-trust Act, Declares Federal Judge.

Chicago, April 21.—The Quaker Oats company is not operating in violation of the Sherman anti-trust act, according to a decision by Judge of appeals here.

The finding came after two days of argument based upon testimony taken in various cities of the country since the suit was filed in June, 1914.

Judge Julian W. Mack and Francis E. Baker found that the government had failed to make out a case against the defendant, but Judge Samuel Alschuler dissented.

The jurists have been sitting as a district court in order to facilitate a possible appeal of the case to the federal supreme court.

GOLTZ GIVES MORE EVIDENCE

Federal Government to Ask For Additional Indictments.
