LIVE STOCK MARKET LETTER

 South St. Paul, Dec. 27, 1915. The cattle run this week was very light, only 900 cattle being on the market, owing to the light receipts, the market held steady in the killing division. Veal calves stock and feeders, steady. Good to choice killing steers from \$7 to \$7.50, select more. Fair to good \$6.50 to \$7. Common to fair from \$5.75 to \$6.25. Good to choice killing cows and heifers \$5.50 to \$6. Extra good, more. Fair to good \$5 to \$5.50. Common to fair \$4.50 to \$5. Cutters from \$4 to \$4.50. Canners \$3.50 to \$3.75. Shelly old cows \$3 or less. Butcher bulls from \$5 to \$5.50. Bolognas from \$4.65 to \$4.90. Common to light bulls from \$4 to \$4.40.

Veal calves top \$8.25, seconds \$6.75, culls from \$5 to \$5.50. Stockers and feeders ruled steady, the select feeding steers selling at \$6.25 to \$6.75. Good to choice feeders from \$6 to \$6.50. Fair to good \$5.25 to \$6. Weiners \$3.75 to \$4.50. Yearlings and calves good to choice \$5.50 to \$6, fair to good from \$5 to \$5.50. Common to fair from \$4.25 to \$5. Stock and feeding heifers \$4.75 to \$5.25. Select, more. Fair to good from \$4.25 to \$4.75. Feeding cows from \$4 to \$4.50. Stock bulls from \$4.25 to \$4.75.

Dairy cows as before the holidays are slow to move only the choice kinds selling for dairy purposes. Good to choice from \$55 to \$70, fair to good from \$40 to \$55.

The hog market today ruled 20 higher sales ranging from \$5.85 to \$6.25, bulk \$5.90 to \$6, pigs around \$5 to \$5.25.

The sheep market held steady, very few of them coming in. Top lambs \$8.50, seconds around \$7.25 and ewes top \$5.75, culls \$3.50 to \$4.25. Bucks around \$4 to \$4.50.
