**Iowa Land Boom Actual Farmers Left Holding Sack, Report Shows**

**T**HE land boom that swept Iowa during the summer of 1919 forced prices of farm lands in that state up to a level at which it was impossible for any, but the exceptional farmer to make more than 3 per cent on his capitalization," says a report of the United States department of agriculture, following an intensive study of the Iowa boom. The department report adds that the boom "made it out of the question for a large proportion of tenants to buy land on borrowed capital with a fair chance of paying out."

Other findings, made as the result of this investigation, were:

The general increase in farm land values in the United States during 1919 was 21 per cent (much less than the decreased purchasing power of the dollar), but in Iowa land values increased 32 per cent, or \$63 an acre.

**CITY RESIDENTS GAIN AT EXPENSE OF FARMER**

Two-thirds of the increase in value on farms bought and resold during the boom was appropriated by residents of towns and cities.

The department report adds: "At current prices for land it is not only financially unprofitable for the tenant to become an owner but for the great majority of tenants it is practically impossible. The average net worth of tenants, as determined by this study, is only about 12 per cent of the average farm capital. Even if the tenant can borrow the remainder of the capital necessary to become an owner, he can not expect to earn, under the favorable conditions with respect to crops and prices prevailing in 1918, more than 3 1/2 per cent on the total capital borrowed. Falling prices for farm products or unfavorable crops would make the prospect even less satisfactory."

The report shows that the boom was largely engineered by land speculators, most of the sellers living in cities or towns and most of the purchasers being actual farmers, who are thus left "holding the sack" and finding it impossible to make interest on their investment, even in a good year.

**WHY SUGAR IS HIGH**

Editor Nonpartisan Leader: It is estimated that the profiteering middlemen now own half the sugar cane and beet land in Cuba, Hawaii and California and hold mortgages on most of the other half, and as they own all of the sugar mills they have gained full power of price-fixing, both for producers and consumers. Unless this land-grabbing and price-fixing is speedily curbed by adequate graduated tax laws the profiteering middlemen will soon acquire all the land, control all production and price-fixing, the same as the old regime in Russia.


