SWEDEN.

The king has granted permission to use the stone walls around the Uranienborg castle, in the island of Heven, for the construction of the foundation of the new church at that place.

A fire at Hammanhog destroyed eight houses and rendered thirteen families homeless.

The seventh edition of the vocabulary of the Swedish academy will be ready in a few months. A few changes will be made in the spelling in this edition, the general aim being to make the spelling conform to the pronunciation. The changes are very conservative, however. The letter a with a ring or two dots over it is most frequently shifted about. But the superfluous d in d remains, and f and v are permitted to do the service of v—the same as f in the English preposition "of."

The army prayer book has been distributed among the recruits in all parts of the country. Fosterlandsstiftelsen has charge of this work, and will have to pay the expenses because it failed in its efforts to have a national subscription taken up for that purpose.

A new bank, with a capital of \$270,000, will be opened next fall in Stockholm.

The health of the crown princess is improving. When last heard from she was staying in Venice.

The oldest inhabitant of the parish of Fulltofta has completed her 92d year. Her physical condition is such that she is in the habit of walking several miles at a time all alone. Last winter she spun considerable quantities of yarn on her wheel. In fact, the general observer would take her to be not over 60 years of age.

Prince Carl and Princess Ingeborg intend to spend a part of the summer in Norway. It is claimed that they will make a trip through Gudbrandsdalen and Romsdalen to Sondmore, returning across the mountains by way of the Otte valley. They may stop a couple of weeks at the Golaas sanatorium, where Prince Carl has stopped before.

Gustaf Fröding will soon publish a new collection of poems which he wrote last winter.

A 60-year-old market woman in Tomelilla has time and again had large quantities of water removed from her abdomen by means of operations. A few days ago about three gallons of water was tapped out; but what is still more remarkable is that three days after the operation the patient was around tending to her work as usual.

As soon as the strikers at the Hoganas coal mines had been beaten, a similar strike broke out at the Fum-lund wooden mills, near Malmo. The wages are fair; but the workmen think there are so many rules and restrictions as to render the workingmen little better than slaves. The most galling rule is that no employee at the wooden mills is allowed to join a labor union.

Up to May 18, about 200 Swedish citizens had petitioned the government for permission to enlist as volunteers in the United States army.

The Exposition Record of Bergen, Norway, contains the following flattering characteristic of Crown Prince Gustaf of Sweden and Norway: "The crown prince, in common with the rest of the members of our royal family, is very considerate in dealing with others. Fairminded in the highest degree, he is always willing to appreciate what is good in others. Fair-mindedness, in fact, seems to be the most prominent trait of his character, and he can never denounce views simply because they are not his own. But he also adheres firmly to his own convictions until he is thoroughly convinced that he is wrong. The crown prince is ardently interested in politics, which he takes pains to study, and he is anxious to benefit the two nations equally. His objective, matter-of-fact way of looking at men and things saves him from one-sidedness and exclusiveness. But he also feels the responsibility of being crown prince, and he does not like to have his person made too conspicuous. The king has great respect for his son, and the crown prince is often consulted when grave matters are to be decided upon. King Oscar knows nothing of that jealousy which many rulers entertain towards their successors, and on this score the relation between father and son is exemplary. Faithful and busy as the crown prince is, he is well qualified for the duties of a ruler. He has the ability of seizing upon the main points of a question, still he does not overlook the details. As a speaker he is concise and emphatic, and his voice is pleasant. The crown prince is fond of open air life. As a pedestrian, as a hunter, and as an angler he is the energetic man of sport, who easily endures all exertions, and who, in the midst of the most exciting bear or reindeer hunt, can keep pace with the most experienced hunters."

NORWAY.

The city council of Tonsberg has granted a private company permission to build and operate an electric lighting plant in that city. The franchise expires in fifteen years, and the contract is such that the city may at any time assume control of the plant.

The liberals were highly delighted with the celebration of the 17th of May this year. Pure flags all over, the attendance and enthusiasm phenomenal, and the conservatives tamer than ever. A merchant at Svolvær carried over \$3,000 in coins when he embarked on a steamer. At the most critical moment

the man fell down, the trunk burst, and the money rolled into the sea. Only \$25 was saved, and it was feared that the fish would swallow most of the coins before they could be reached by a diver.

A certain piece of ground in Kristiania which brought \$100,000 last year was recently sold for a little over \$200,000.

A Swedish paper of May 23 states that Jacob Sverdrup, the bishop-elect of Bergen, who has been kept in bed with pleurisy ever since he received his appointment as bishop, has been completely given up by the physicians.

The members of the storting rose to their feet when the death of Gladstone was announced, and the president said he was sure that every Norwegian man and woman shared the sorrow of the English people. A telegram of condolence was sent to the widow of Gladstone by the storting.

The quarters of the Catholic hospital in Fredrikstad were sold for \$14,000, and more commodious quarters were at once bought for \$4,000 less.

An English steamer caught 1,800 halibuts in Vesteralen, and as soon as it arrived in England about 100 other steamers made a rush for Norway to try their luck.

New buildings are rising along nearly every street in Stavanger, and a great number of old ones are repaired or enlarged.

Norwegian and Swedish democrats had a very peaceful conference in Kristiania. There were 180 delegates, 26 of whom were Swedes. Four sets of resolutions were introduced, some of them dealing with the union question. In order to avoid the ill feeling that might be aroused by taking a vote the meeting resolved to print all the proposed resolutions in the minutes and scatter these far and wide among the workmen. The next convention will be held in 1899 in Gothenburg.

Those having the inside track aver that the storting cannot wind up the work of the present session earlier than June 15.

After a year's struggle, the painters of Kristiania have settled their strike and come down to peaceful work.

The Nasoen property in Asker, near Kristiania, has been sold to a syndicate for \$120,000. The land will be parcelled out in lots suitable for residences and summer cottages.

The population of Kristiania Dec. 31, 1897, was 203,324, an increase of 11,183 for one year.

Captain Peterson sued the Krag-Jorgensen rifle company, claiming that he was entitled to 25 per cent of the profits derived from the deal made with the government of the United States; but the courts decided that the captain is entitled to only 15 per cent of said profits.

The armored cruiser Tordenskjold has been delivered to the Norwegian government. It is the same size as its twin, Harald Haarfagre, and the trip from Newcastle to Horten proved the vessel to be a good sailor.

A singing festival took place in Kristiansand on Pentecost Sunday. About 450 singers from the extreme south were in attendance.

The storting has made an appropriation for an observatory on the Halde mountain, Nordland, for the study of northern lights.

DENMARK.

The poet Schandorph has had an unique experience for a man of his fame and age. About a year ago he removed to Lyngby in order to be able to lead a quiet life. Last winter a school teacher of the place came and asked him to write a couple of poems to be sung upon the arrival of Prince Christian and his bride at the Sorgenfri palace. Schandorph wrote two short poems, one to be sung before and the other after the address. But a few weeks later the poet was informed that only the first poem could be sung. Now came the turn for the poet to kick. He explained to his fastidious customers that they would have to do one of two things, sing both poems, or the second one only, for under no circumstances would he permit them to sing the first one alone. In the midst of these woes the poet is cruel enough to write up the whole thing, including his poems, and turn it over to the press.

The Danish tourist club has made arrangements for a trip to Iceland, and numerous applications for accommodations have been received from Denmark and neighboring countries.

Turkish papers admit that Prince Georg may soon be appointed governor of Crete.

A Danish ship came too close to some German warships which were practicing on the target at Holtenau, and was struck by a torpedo, so that it had to be run up against the shore before sinking in deep water.

The East Asia steamship company has just purchased its third steamer, which has a displacement of 6,000 tons.

The question of closing the stores early in the evening is agitated in Copenhagen. The cigar stores bid fair to take the lead in this movement by closing much earlier than usual.

Cases of cerebro-spinal meningitis have become so frequent in Copenhagen that the disease may be said to be epidemic. The real nursery for the pest is as usual—the Solvgade barracks; but it takes time for the authorities to make provisions for vacating this fatal building.

Has a Dane solved the problem of making a serviceable chainless bicycle? So we are told. About noon, May 22, a large concourse of people could be seen at the Copenhagen free harbor. Mr. Willadsen, a young wheelman, was expected to return from a trip to Paris and back made exclusively on a chainless bicycle. It was announced that he had been delayed at Roskilde, and that he would not arrive before 3 o'clock. But that did not chill the enthusiasm of the crowd. His arrival was the signal for cheers and shouts as though he had been a great hero, and a gentleman made a speech in which he skillfully made the wheelman and the makers of the chainless wheel reflect honor upon the Danish people.

MINNESOTA NEWS.

Sheep Skins.

The regents of the university met at the state farm and determined upon the list of graduates. This list, as completed, contains 296 names, as follows: College of science, literature and the arts, 118; higher degrees, 14; mechanical engineering, 20; mining, 11; law, 93; medicine, 14; dentistry, 14; pharmacy, 12. Degrees have been issued to two students who have died within the last three months, Edna M. Stock and Carl Huhn. During the year there have been 25 students dropped from the senior classes of the academic department, so blighting their hopes of graduation this spring. From the other departments pupils failed to gain sheepskins as follows: Medicine, 5; pharmacy, 3; law, 3; dentistry, 2.

A Statue for Pillsbury.

A statue of Governor John S. Pillsbury will ornament the campus of the university. That was decided at the annual meeting of the university alumni. The movement was started a year ago when E. C. Chatfield introduced a resolution declaring that a statue on the campus would be a fitting recognition of Governor Pillsbury's services to the university. A committee composed of Messrs. Chatfield, Partridge, Gillette and Quinn was named to investigate and report. They investigated and evidently to good purpose, for recently they had entered into a contract with Daniel C. French of New York to erect the statue within three years at a cost of \$15,000.

MINNESOTA AT OMAHA.

The State Will Make a Good Showing at Trans-Mississippi and International Exposition.

We illustrate with this the Minnesota Building at the Trans-Mississippi and International Exposition, which began at Omaha, June 1st, and continues until December 1st. The building is one of the group of state buildings, occupying a district on an elevation of ground, overlooking the valley of Missouri. In this group of state buildings is included New York, Kansas, Missouri, Montana, Illinois, Nebraska, Colorado and some other of the western states. The Minnesota building differs materially from all these structures and is likely to prove one of the most unique and attractive buildings on the ground. The building has a total length of 75 feet and a width of 42 feet, with a verandah 12 feet wide all around it, making the greatest length nearly 100 feet and the greatest width 66 feet. The building is not designed for exhibition purposes, but is to be used as rendezvous for the Minnesota visitors to the Exposition. On the first floor there is a spacious hallway 42x35 feet. In one end is located the ladies' parlor, which is 30x20 feet and which will be tastefully decorated and furnished daintily. It will be a favorite resting place for the Minnesota ladies who visit the Exposition. The corresponding room at the other end of the building is to be finished in the style of a lumber camp, its walls hung with skins and decorated with trophies of the chase. A wide stairway leads to the second floor where there are two corresponding rooms. The second floor is surrounded also by a verandah amply shaded by the overhanging roof of the main building.
