THE PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES.

A List of Those Who Pay Personal Property Taxes in Kandiyohi County and the Rates of Taxation.

For the information of its readers the TRIBUNE will publish a complete list of the personal property taxes. The list are copied by the TRIBUNE and are published solely as a matter of news. These taxes must be paid by March 1 next or the penalty will be added.

The rates of state and county taxes are as follows:

State Taxes: 1.8 mills. State School: 1.2 mills. County Revenue Taxes: 4.5 mills. County Road and Bridges: 4.5 mills.

Total of general taxes: 7.78 mills.

By adding the town and school rates given above the list of each town to the total rate given above, the total rate in any case may be easily computed.



OLOF OLSON HAS PASSED AWAY.

Late Distinguished Citizen of Willmar Succumbs to Death at St. Paul After a Brief Illness.

In the midst of life, in the full power of manhood's prime, a man prominent in our county affairs in the past and later in a more extended sphere, has suddenly been summoned to the land of the hereafter.

Olof Olson, Grand Recorder of the A. O. U. W., was stricken with typhoid fever a couple of weeks ago. He was taken to St. Joseph's hospital, St. Paul, where the best of care was given him.

Olof Olson was born in Langnäs, Sweden, Dec. 3, 1858. With his parents he came to America in 1867. The family lived one year in Illinois, after which they moved to this county and settled on a farm in town of Kandiyohi.

He then came to Willmar, where he obtained a position in Clark & Frost's drug store. His faithful attention to duty soon drew attention to him, and his genial nature made him a host of friends.

In the spring of 1889 Olson was elected mayor of Willmar, and was re-elected in 1900, serving until September of the same year, when the office of the Grand Recorder was by order of the Grand Lodge moved to Minneapolis, and he had to bid Willmar goodby.

Mr. Olson was twice married. On June 11, 1881, he was united in marriage to Miss Emma C. Johnson, daughter of Gustaf Johnson of Kandiyohi.
