They will also visit with Edblom's brother and sister at Kenmare, N. D., before returning to their home at Eugene, Oregon.

For many years we had desired to visit not only Sweden but other European countries, and in April we left the Pacific coast for the East. After many stops on this continent we crossed the Atlantic in the Mauretania, one of the largest steamships afloat, where we enjoyed the finest accommodations.

Reaching England in safety, we began our journey northward for Scotland, stopping here and there to see how the "Hinglishman" did things. We reached Glasgow in the Lowlands of Scotland, which are so underlaid with coal and iron that it is now the chief manufacturing place of the globe.
