The aggressive M. D. of Brooten, Dr. Stewart Leech, is doing some effective work in combating the sale of liquor to Indians in Northern Minnesota, and also the shameful trafficking in Indian lands. Uncle Sam is more solicitous about the welfare of his wards, the Red Men, than he is about his own sons. The federal laws are very strict in regard to furnishing them with "fire water." The report is that not only this prohibition is shamefully disregarded, but that a regular business has sprung up in trafficking in Indian lands. The Red Man has been up against it since the very first time that he touched the pen and signed away his right to the great territory of this state. The Trader has always been at hand to prey upon his necessities and drive hard bargains. The Interior Department should get busy and clean out the grafters and enforce the laws. The present conditions in some of the places of Minnesota are a stench to the nostrils of honest men.

DRAINAGE ON THE FARM.

The College of Agriculture, University of Minnesota, has an expert in farm drainage now on its faculty. For the past year, Prof. J. T. Stewart has been teaching this subject in the College and has been giving aid to the farmers of the state in planning drainage systems and in explaining the benefits of tile drainage. Prof. Stewart is also an expert road engineer. In all of his work he is practical. He does not advise the impossible, but rather seeks better drainage systems and better road building by pointing a way that comes within the means of the farmer and the farm community. He gives information freely and without expense to the farmers. He has issued a very interesting illustrated bulletin entitled "Installation of an Experimental Drainage System," which may be obtained free of cost by applying directly to him at the College of Agriculture.
