OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNTY BOARD

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' ANNUAL JANUARY MEETING.

State of Minnesota, ss. County Auditor's Office, Willmar, Minnesota, January 8, 1911.

The Board of County Commissioners of the said Kandiyohti County convened in regular session this date at 2 o'clock p. m. pursuant to law. Members present: Commissioners Olson, Johnson and Swanson and Commissioners Reigstad and Boese-elect. Absent: None.

The Board organized by electing Commissioner Thos. H. Olson, Chairman for the ensuing year. Commissioner N. B. Johnson was elected vice Chairman for the ensuing year. The Board proceeded to open bids filed for the county printing and publishing for the year 1911, which said bids were as follows, to wit: Bid of the Journal Publishing Company, per Charles F. Spencer, offering to publish the annual financial statement of Kandiyohti County, proceedings of the Board of Equalization, reports of the Board of Audit, Ditch Notices, Notice of Teachers' Examinations, the annual report of the County Superintendent of Schools and all other notices required by law to be published at 39 cents per folio for the first publication and 18 cents per folio for each subsequent publication, and 13 cents per description for publishing the delinquent tax list.

On motion a recess was taken until 2 o'clock p. m. January 4, 1911. Pursuant to adjournment the matter of establishing, raising and maintaining the waters of Foot Lake, in Kandiyohti County, Minnesota, at a fixed and uniform height was taken up at this time for further consideration.

On motion the following notice of hearing was issued and adopted:

DISTRICT COURT.
12th Judicial District.
State of Minnesota, County of Kandiyohti.
In the Matter of Establishing, Raising and Maintaining the Waters of Foot Lake, in Kandiyohti County, Minnesota, at a Fixed and Uniform Height, Whereas the County Board of Kandiyohti County and State of Minnesota, at a session held on the 15th day of November, 1910, to consider the establishment, raise and maintenance of the waters of Foot Lake, a public lake situated wholly in Kandiyohti County, Minnesota, and upon the height, did hear evidence therein, and from the evidence adduced, both oral and written, the said County Board of Kandiyohti County and State of Minnesota, did determine a certain height of water which it deemed it necessary that the water in said lake should be established, raised and maintained, and the County Board has ascertained with reasonable certainty, the entire cost of raising the water of said lake to the specified height.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given that the said County Board will on the 26th day of January, A. D. 1911, at 10 o'clock a. m. of said day, apply to the above said Court at chambers at the Court House in the City of Willmar, Kandiyohti County, State of Minnesota, for the appointment of three disinterested resident freeholders of the State of Minnesota as assessors of benefits and damages in the premises and will appoint such assessors and fix their compensation, and the time and place of such assessors' first meeting, and will consider such other and further business as the Court shall deem proper herein.
