Numerous complaints have been made to the Mayor and to this office of the burning of manure and rubbish (such as straw) inside the city limits, the same is absolutely prohibited at any time of the year. All those having filled in their lots with manure and rubbish, are at present required to cover the same with 6 inches of earth by May 1st of each year. Hereafter all those wishing to fill up their lots with manure and rubbish (as ashes) must first get permission from the Board of Health and the said filling must be done between the 1st of Nov. of one year and the 15th of April of the year following and then covered with earth by May 1st.
