





### PLANS FOR "UNIVERSITY WEEK AT WILLMAR"

Plans are being made for a "University Week" at Willmar this summer in place of an ordinary chautauqua. This "week" would be filled with good things provided by the faculty of the University, and would be in the nature of extension work of the most approved kind. The days would be filled with instructive lectures and demonstrations with kindergarten work for children and a camp for the boys, which would all be free to everybody. An entertainment would be provided each evening for which a charge would be made. The total local cost of the "week" will not exceed \$600, which it is proposed to raise by selling season tickets at a dollar each. The local management would be vested in a committee of nine to be composed of the superintendent of the city schools, four farmers, two ladies from Woman's Clubs and two members of the Commercial Club. Assurances have been received from the University that a sufficient number of towns have responded to make the plan a success. This "University Week" at Willmar will come on the second week in June, if the plans materialize.

### FEDERAL BUILDING ACCEPTED

**Delay of a Car of Furniture Will Delay Opening Five or Six Weeks.**

Two U. S. Government building inspectors were at Willmar yesterday and gave the new Federal building at Willmar its final inspection. We understand that the Bjorsell contract was accepted as completely filled, while some minor changes were suggested for some of the fittings. The building is beautifully finished on the interior, and will be the pride of Willmar. The postoffice boxes and windows are in place, but a carload of furniture ordered from Philadelphia has not yet been shipped from that place and will delay the opening of the new building probably until some time in May.

### Will Command a Whaler.

Capt. Conrad Christianson, who has been employed with Peterson & Wellin of this city, has received an offer to take command of a whaling vessel for the Alaska Whale Fishing Company, and will leave Tuesday for Seattle to take the necessary examination in American Navigation laws before obtaining his commission. The vessel is now on its way from Norway by way of Cape Horn. His family will remain at Willmar for the present. His Willmar friends wish Capt. Christianson all kinds of good luck.
