CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF THE KANDIYOHI COUNTY SILCO COMPANY.

We, the undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter fifty-eight (58), Revised Laws of Minnesota for 1905, and any amendments thereof, do hereby associate ourselves as a body corporate, and do hereby adopt the following Certificate of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be Kandiyohi County Silco Company.

The principal nature of its business shall be to manufacture, sell and erect Cement Silos and such other business as may be necessary in connection therewith.

The principal place of transacting the business of this corporation shall be in the City of Willmar, County of Kandiyohi and State of Minnesota.

ARTICLE II. The time for the commencement of this corporation shall be April 24th, A. D. 1914, and the period of its duration shall be thirty years.

ARTICLE III. The names and places of residence of the persons forming this corporation are: Martin Peterson, Willmar, Minnesota; A. O. Forsberg, Willmar, Minnesota; Lewis Johnson, Willmar, Minnesota.

ARTICLE IV. The management of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, composed of not less than three and not more than five members. The names and addresses of the first Board of Directors are: Martin Peterson, Willmar, Minnesota; A. O. Forsberg, Willmar, Minnesota; Lewis Johnson, Willmar, Minnesota.

The first officers of the corporation shall be: President, Martin Peterson; Vice President, A. O. Forsberg; Secretary-Treasurer, Lewis Johnson. All of the above named officers and directors shall hold their respective offices aforesaid until the next annual meeting of the corporation.

The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first day of January in each year; immediately after the election of directors, or as soon thereafter as practicable. The directors shall meet and elect from their number a president and a vice president, and from their number or from the stockholders, a secretary and treasurer. Any office, except that of president or vice president, may be held by one person. The directors and officers of the corporation shall hold their respective offices, until their successors have been duly elected and entered upon the discharge of their duties.

The first meetings of the stockholders and of the Board of Directors shall be held at the office of the company in the City of Willmar on the 25th day of April, A. D. 1914, at 10 and 11 o'clock respectively.

ARTICLE V. The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, which shall be paid in in full, by the stockholders, in such manner, at such time, and in such amounts as the Board of Directors shall order. The capital stock shall be divided into One Thousand shares of the par value of Ten Dollars each. Each stockholder shall have one vote for each share of stock held by him at all meetings of the stockholders.

ARTICLE VI. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation shall at any time be subject shall be the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.
