CERTIFIED COPY OF AMENDMENT TO CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF THE KANDIYOH COUNTY FAIR ASSOCIATION.

At a special meeting of the stockholders of the Kandiyohi County Fair Association, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota, which meeting was duly convened pursuant to law and at which meeting were present, either person or by proxy, the owners of Ten shares of the capital stock of said corporation, the following resolution was duly adopted by the affirmative vote of all stockholders present.

Resolved that Article V of the Certificate of Incorporation of the Kandiyohi County Fair Association be amended so as to increase the capital stock of said corporation from Twenty-five Thousand Dollars to Fifty Thousand Dollars, to diminish the number of shares of the capital stock of said corporation from Two Thousand and Five Hundred shares to Two Thousand shares, and that the par value of said shares be increased from Ten Dollars to Twenty Dollars per share, so that said Article as amended shall read as follows:

ARTICLE V. The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be Fifty Thousand Dollars, which shall be paid in money or property, or both, in such amount as the Board of Directors shall order. The Capital stock shall be divided into Two Thousand shares of the par value of Twenty-five Dollars each.

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF THE KANDIYOH COUNTY FAIR ASSOCIATION.

We, the undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter Fifty-eight (58), Revised Laws of Minnesota for 1905, and any amendments thereof, do hereby associate ourselves as a body corporate, and do hereby adopt the following Certificate of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be Kandiyohi County Silo Company. The general nature of its business shall be to make, manufacture, sell and erect Cement Stave Silos and such other business thereof as may be necessary in connection therewith.

ARTICLE II. The time for the commencement of this corporation shall be April 24th, A. D. 1914, and the period of its duration shall be thirty years.

ARTICLE III. The names and places of residence of the persons forming this corporation are: Martin Peterson, Willmar, Minnesota; A. O. Forsberg, Willmar, Minnesota; Lewis Johnson, Willmar, Minnesota.

ARTICLE IV. The management of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, composed of not less than three and not more than five members. The names and addresses of the first Board of Directors are: Martin Peterson, Willmar, Minnesota; A. O. Forsberg, Willmar, Minnesota; and Lewis Johnson, Willmar, Minnesota.
