

ORDINANCE NO. 148.

An Ordinance Regulating the Running at Large of Dogs Within the Limits of the City of Willmar, and imposing a Tax on the Same.

Be it ordained by the City of Willmar as follows:

Section 1.—No person within the limits of the City of Willmar, being the owner or keeper of any dog, male or female, shall allow the same to run at large within the limits of the said City without first having paid the tax and procured license for each and every dog, so allowed to run at large, as herein provided.

Section 2.—Any person desiring a license for any such dog, of which he or she is the owner or keeper, to run at large within the limits of said City, shall annually, on the 1st day of June of each and every year, cause said dog to be described, registered and numbered by the City Clerk of said City, and shall pay to the City Clerk, as and for a tax and license for such dog to run at large within the limits of said City, the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) for every male dog and the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for every female dog.

Section 3.—Whenever any person has fully complied with the provisions of Section 2 of this ordinance, the City Clerk of said City shall issue to the owner of such dog, a license allowing such dog to run at large within the limits of said City for the period of one year. Provided, however, that all licenses issued under this ordinance shall expire on the 31st day of May following their issue.

Section 4.—In case of the failure by or on the part of any such owner or keeper to pay the tax and license upon any such dog, or to have the same run at large within the limits of said City, the said dog or dogs shall be surrendered upon the demand of and to the Police, and shall be held by the Police for the period of twenty-four (24) hours thereafter, and in the event the owner or keeper of any such dog or dogs, so impounded, shall desire to redeem such dog or dogs, he or she shall be permitted to do so at any time within the said twenty-four hours, upon the payment to said Chief of Police of the tax and license hereinbefore provided for, and in addition thereto, the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) as a fee to the Police for impounding and keeping said dog or dogs, and in case any such dog or dogs, so impounded as aforesaid, shall not be redeemed by the owner or keeper thereof by payment of the tax or license and the fee as aforesaid, then and in that case the said Chief of Police is hereby authorized and required to, and shall, kill such dog or dogs.

Provided, however, that if any owner or keeper of any dog or dogs shall fail to surrender up to said Chief of Police any dog or dogs in his or her possession upon demand of said Chief of Police, or in case the said Chief of Police shall fail to find the owner or keeper of any dog or dogs running at large within the limits of said City, then it shall be lawful for said Chief of Police, and it shall be his duty, to the end that the said dog or dogs shall be regarded and treated as though no license had ever been paid on the same.

Section 5.—Any person, being the owner or keeper of any dog or dogs, male or female, who shall allow or permit any such dog or dogs to run at large within the limits of said City without first having paid the tax or license therefor, as hereinbefore provided, or any such person who shall refuse or neglect to surrender up, on the demand of and to the said Chief of Police, any dog or dogs upon which the tax or license has been paid, or any person who shall allow or permit any such dog or dogs to run at large within the limits of said City without wearing the collar prescribed in Section 2 hereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be liable to a fine not more than thirty days.

Section 6.—All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7.—This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.

That Jackson Street, in Glarum's Addition to the City of Willmar; and Maud Street, in Spicer's Addition to the City of Willmar; shall be hereafter known and designated as "3rd Street, East."

That Grant Street, in Glarum's Addition to the City of Willmar; and Maud Street, in Spicer's Addition to the City of Willmar; shall be hereafter known and designated as "4th Street, East."

That Lincoln Street, in Glarum's Addition to the City of Willmar; and Agnes Street, in Spicer's Addition to the City of Willmar; shall be hereafter known and designated as "5th Street, East."

That Bertha Street, lying West of Ferring's Addition to the City of Willmar, and extending from Becker Avenue on the South to the railroad right of way on the North; shall be hereafter known and designated as "6th Street, East."

Section 2.—This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
