Washington, Aug. 12.—Administration leaders have concluded that additional revenue legislation eventually will be needed to fill the gap in the government coffers caused by loss of revenue on imports cut off by the European war.

SINKS SUBMARINE WITH TWO SHOTS. British Cruiser Soon Disposes of German Craft. Edinburg, Aug. 12.—The Scotsman prints the story of an eyewitness of the naval battle between British cruisers and German submarines in which the submarine U 15 was lost.

AUSTRIANS ARE DISLOGGED. Russians Claim Victory in Enemy's Country. St. Petersburg, via London, Aug. 12.—The Russian general staff announces that Russian troops dislodged a large body of Austrian troops from the entrenched village of Antofe, in Austrian Galicia, to the southwest of Radvilov, in the Russian province of Volhynia. The Russians sbered a section of the Fifteenth Austrian Infantry, while the Thirtieth Austrian lancers and the Thirty-third Austrian landwehr fled in disorder.

ATLANTIC ROUTE IS OPEN. Ships Will Again Sail Between England and Canada. Montreal, Aug. 12.—News came officially from Ottawa that the ocean route is clear from Montreal to Liverpool and that ships can sail when they please in perfect safety.
