



PLAN PUBLIC LIVESTOCK MARKET



The Minnesota State Fair, September 6 to 11, is planning to turn its million-dollar livestock show into a great public market place this fall, to assist in the introduction of more purebred farm animals in the Northwest. Indian and sheep will be emphasized as much as the one for horses. There is a need, for more sheep in the Northwest to turn waste pasture land into wool and mutton, and aid farmers in clearing up their raw farms and keeping weeds under control. Last year over 200 sheep were sold at private sale at the Minnesota State Fair, but it is probable that a much larger number will be disposed of this year.

Soho Square, London.
Soho is perhaps the most curiously derived place name in London. According to Samuel Pegge, the antiquary, Soho square, which has given a name to the district, was first called Monmouth square when the III flatted Duke of Monmouth had a house there. Upon the duke's defeat and execution in 1685 the square was ordered to be called King's square, and a statue of King Charles II, was set up in the middle of it. But the partition of the Duke of Monmouth, wishing to preserve a distant remembrance of his leader, called it Soho square, from "Soho" a hunting cry adopted by the duke as his watchword at the battle where he was taken prisoner.-London Saturday Review.



BIG BABY SHOW

Many Attractive Features at Minnesota State Fair Baby Show.
The baby show is to be one of the big educational features of the Minnesota State Fair September 6 to 11, as a result of plans recently made by Mrs. Bertha Dahl Laws, of Appleton, Minn., superintendent in charge. It is to be given a prominence never received before.
In order to impress upon all visitors at the fair the importance of proper conditions of babies are to be conducted in a big glass cage in the center of the Woman's Building. The mental test will be carried on in a closed apartment at the rear of the glass cage, where nothing can distract their attention.
The purpose of this public examination is to demonstrate the differences between inferior and superior physical development, and show parents how to look for weaknesses.
As formerly there are to be three different classes of children. Children from the country, children from towns and villages under 2,500, and children from towns and cities over 2,500. In each class there are sub-classes for boys 12 months old and under 24, girls 12 months old and under 24, boys 24 months old and under 36, and girls 24 months old and under 36. All prizes are to consist of ribbons and medals, except the championships, \$25 being given the most perfect boy and girl.
The Webb Publishing Co. of St. Paul, is furnishing all prizes, and will also give \$25 more in case either champion lives in the country. Entries are limited to 100 and only Minnesota babies can compete.

HAMLIN TO HOLD WONDERFUL SHOW

Superior Exhibit of Farm Products Ever Assembled at Any American Fair.
One of the great educational features of the Minnesota State Fair, September 6 to 11, will be the farm products show. In it fruit, vegetables, grains, grasses, corn, and other farm crops will be shown in larger amounts than at any other State Fair in the country.
Nearly \$17,000 in prizes is offered by the horticultural and agricultural departments. Agricultural exhibits, including the county exhibits, are given \$9,892 in cash prizes and \$1,750 in trophies. Potatoes, stock vegetables, grains and seeds, and grasses receive unusual attention, as all these crops are very successfully grown in Minnesota. Prizes of \$518 are offered for regular corn classes, while \$303 is given for boys' exhibits of corn.
Advertising Feature.
The county exhibits at the Minnesota State Fair, known everywhere as one of the greatest advertising features of its nature in America, are given considerable attention, \$5,910 in cash prizes and trophies being awarded. Practically one-half of the counties in the State will be represented
