## COUNTY BOARD SPECIAL SESSION

### Official Proceedings Relative to the Matter of County Ditch No. 36.

State of Minnesota, County of Kandiyohi,—ss.  
County Auditor's Office, Willmar, Minn.,  
July 12, 1916.

In the Matter of County Ditch No. 36 in the Town of Edwards, said county and state.

The Board of County Commissioners of said county, met at the Office of the County Auditor, in the City of Willmar, on above date at 4 o'clock p. m., pursuant to call and notice. All members present. Meeting called to order by the chairman, N. B. JOHNSON.

The Petition of W. Strootman, Jr., and others for a public ditch in the town of Edwards, said county, was presented and publicly read.

Frauds consisting, mailing, serving and publication of the several notices in the matter as provided by law, were examined and found regular. Interested parties present were also given an opportunity to be heard in the matter.

Upon due deliberation and consideration of the matter, a motion duly made, seconded and carried, that the petition be accepted and that the Board proceed to appoint Engineer and Viewers in this matter.

Thereupon the following resolution was passed and adopted by a full vote of the Board:

**Resolution Appointing Engineer in Ditch Proceedings.**

In the Matter of the Petition of W. Strootman, Sr., and Others For Location and Construction of County Ditch No. 36 in the County of Kandiyohi, State of Minnesota.

State of Minnesota, County of Kandiyohi,—ss.  
Whereas, A petition bearing date the 3rd day of June, 1916, signed by W. Strootman, Sr., and others, praying for the establishment of a ditch in said county, designated and numbered by the County Auditor as County Ditch No. 36 the route of which is more fully described in said petition, and a proper benefit therefrom would be derived, have been filed with the County Auditor of said County, as by law required.

And, Whereas, It appears by satisfactory proof to the County Board of Kandiyohi County, that due notice of the pendency of said petition, and the time and place at which and under what authority, has been given as required by law.

Now, Therefore, We, the County Board of said County, at a special session held at Willmar, Minn., do hereby appoint J. A. Rowat, Engineer, to make an accurate survey of said ditch from its source to its outlet, as provided and specified in and by Chapter 44 of the General Statutes of 1913 and acts amendatory thereof, and by completing his duties, said engineer, to make and file his report with the County Auditor of said County, as soon as practicable.

Viewers in the matter were then appointed, whereupon the following Order was issued and adopted by full vote of the Board:

**Order Appointing Viewers—Ditch Proceedings.**

In the Matter of the Petition of W. Strootman, Jr., and Others for County Ditch No. 36 in the County of Kandiyohi, State of Minnesota.

Whereas, A petition bearing date the 3rd day of June, 1916, signed by W. Strootman, Sr., and others, praying for the establishment of a ditch in said county, designated and numbered by the County Auditor as County Ditch No. 36, the route of which is more fully described in said petition, together with a proper bond accompanying the same, has been filed with the County Auditor of said County, and said County Auditor has given due notice of the pendency of said petition, and the said notice has been published and served as by law required, and hearing held on said petition, pursuant to said notice, and the County Board of said County have heretofore duly appointed a competent engineer, to-wit: J. A. Rowat, Willmar, Minnesota, to make a survey of said ditch.

Now, Therefore, We, the County Board of said County, at a special session held this 12th day of July, 1916, do hereby appoint C. A. Harrison, town of Kandiyohi, and C. T. Skindelen, town of Arcanator, and Elias Johnson, town of New Lee, three resident freeholders of said County, who are not interested in the construction of said proposed work, and not of kin to any of the parties known to be interested in said ditch, to be Viewers of said proposed work and of the route thereof. The said Viewers shall first take an oath to faithfully perform their duties as such Viewers; and thereafter, having received a certified copy of the petition for said ditch and of the order appointing them such Viewers and of the order of the County Board of said County designating the time and place of the first meeting of said Viewers shall meet at the time and place so designated in the order of the County Auditor aforesaid and shall proceed to view said proposed work, and the land damaged or benefited thereby; and, having completed said view and examination of said work, shall make and file their report thereof with said County Auditor of said County within thirty days from the date of their first meeting. In said report they shall in tabular form give the names of the owners of each tract of land to be benefited or damaged by said proposed work, the description of each tract of land so benefited or damaged (said names of owners to be the same as appear on the County tax duplicates of said County, and the description to be given in legal form), and the total number of acres in each of said tracts, the estimated number of acres in each tract to be benefited or damaged (as the case may be), the number of acres added to any tract by the construction of said ditch, or any other added land; the damage, if any, to riparian rights pertaining to any tract, and the amount that each tract of land will be benefited or damaged by the construction of said ditch. In case said ditch drains either in whole or in part, any public or corporate road or railroad, or benefits any such road, that the roadbed or traveled track of any such road will be made better by the construction of said ditch, said Viewers shall estimate the benefits arising therefrom to said road, roadbeds, or railroads, and report said benefits together with the names of roads and other particulars necessary to identify the corporations, private or public, to be benefited thereby, and amounts of such benefits, and shall report as part of such tabular statement the damages awarded to said road, roadbeds, or other corporation for injury to any road or roadbed, and from the necessary construction and maintenance of any bridge, culverts or other works rendered necessary by the establishment of such
