

An Old Drought Cure. An old time specific for drought was simple enough. It was only necessary to burn fern. An interesting reference to this belief occurs in a manuscript letter preserved in the Pococke collection in the British museum. It is dated Aug. 1, 1636. It runs: "To My Very Loving Friend, the High Sheriff of the County of Stafford—Sr: His majesty, having taken notice of an opinion entertained in Staffordshire that the burning of fern doth draw down rain and being desirous that the country and himself may enjoy fair weather as long as he remains in those parts, hath commanded me to write unto you to cause all burning of fern to be forborne."
