

LUTHERAN BROTHERHOOD BUILDING AT CAMP DODGE.

The Lutheran Brotherhood building Camp Dodge is located in the middle of the camp along with other large public buildings as the main auditorium of the Y. M. C. A., the Knights of Columbus Hall, the Y. M. C. A. Hostess House, the Camp Theatre and the Camp Library building. The building is 60x150 feet and heated with steam. The main floor has a large social room where current papers, magazines, books, phonographs, writing material and a piano will be kept for the use of the boys. Two large open fireplaces in the room will help to make it more cheery. On the same floor is an auditorium which will seat about 1,000 persons. The front of the room is made with a removable altar railing, and sliding doors in front of the altar. Thus the room can well be used for services or general entertainments.

On the second floor are found five rooms for workers in the building and a large room for the use of the military officers. Here is also found a restroom for ladies and toilet for men. The basement has a large furnace and coal rooms, garage, toilet, shower baths and janitors quarters. Undoubtedly, it is one of the best buildings in the camp.

We are indebted to Rev. D. A. Knock for use of above cut and the description of the building. The dedication of the building, Dec. 6, drew large crowds, especially from the Norwegian Lutherans. Among the speakers present were Dr. Andreen and Rev. C. J. Bengtson of Rock Island and Dr. G. A. Brandelle of Denver. On Sundays and Thursdays, the services are attended by large crowds.

FIRST SHEEP SALE A GREAT SUCCESS

All of Rusten's Breeding Stock Offering and Western Sheep Were Sold.

Mr. Rusten's sale of sheep last Monday brought him \$2,644.50, for 147 head. While this was not an extravagant price as live stock goes now, still the fact he was able to dispose of them at the home farm with no trouble to market them was an advantage. Mr. Rusten is much pleased with the interest taken in his sale and with the fact that the breeding stock was all purchased by farmers in this vicinity as foundations for future flocks, and wishes to express his thanks thru The Tribune to all who contributed to make it a success. Mr. Rusten is a sheep enthusiast and has demonstrated to his own entire satisfaction that sheep make a most valuable side-line on the Kandiyohi county farm. He has kept not less than 100 sheep during each of the past five or six years and has never realized less than \$1,000 per annum from this herd. One hundred ewes which he purchased at Aberdeen last year has netted him to date \$1,774 after deducting what he paid for them.
