HAIL LOSSES MET BY STATE SYSTEM

Two Canadian Provinces are Providing Protection at Low Cost.

The 1927 report of the State Hall Insurance Commission of Saskatchewan recently published, contains interesting information for farmers who believe in State Hall insurance.

No private company does business on such a small margin. Generally the private company that have from \$25 to \$50 or more to pay field agents, general agents, officers, office expense, advertising, and private profits.

Methods of Operation. By the Saskatchewan plan an extra tax of 4 cents an acre is levied, with few exceptions, on the land of the municipality (county) which has decided to accept the state insurance.

Previous to 1917 Alberta levied only a flat tax on all assessable lands, but in that year the act was amended to provide (1) a flat tax of 5 cents an acre on all land; and (2) an additional levy on crop area only.

League Advocates State System. From the beginning the Nonpartisan League has advocated state hall insurance similar to that of Saskatchewan and Alberta as a simple, easy method of cutting down one of the expenses of farming.
