DON'T DELAY YOUR BOY'S XMAS BOX

Early Mailing Urged to Avoid Last Day's Rush. Be Sure to Mail in Time.

Many of the people of the county having boys overseas have, already received their Christmas package label, but comparatively few packed boxes have been sent from the mailing station.

Mrs. Russell Spicer, chairman of the county Red Cross Chapter urges that the boxes be packed and brought in as soon as the label is received to avoid the rush of the last days. According to latest orders Christmas boxes may also be sent by families who have some member in overseas service as nurse, doctor, Red Cross, Y. M. C. A., K. of C. or Salvation Army workers. Only the nearest relative is supposed to send a Christmas box to one of these workers, and he must sign for a carton, stating the relationship to the person to whom he must sign for a carton, stating the cartons can also be secured at the Red Cross headquarters.


