Editor Tribune: I see in the Willmar Tribune for September 3rd an article about that the dairy men selling milk in Willmar are furnishing milk below grade. As I am one of them, I wish to say that this is not true in my case. I have sold milk in Willmar for the past eighteen years and never had my milk too thin according to test, and it exceeded the test this time. Also on August 1st, 1918, I advanced the price of milk from 25 to 28 cents per gallon and coffee cream to 28 cents per quart and said I could not guarantee coffee cream to be 30 per cent at that price because the high price of feed made it impossible.
