Allen, of Kansas, eight-four per cent of the farms in that state were worked by owners in the year 1880. In 1918 only 52 per cent of the farms were worked by owners, and 48 per cent by tenants. What percentage of these alleged owners consists of mortgagors the Governor does not say. He does say that tenantry is highest in the best counties and low ownership in the poorest. And some counties tenantry is in the majority. And he furthermore remarks that similar conditions prevail in Illinois, Iowa, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Ohio and Indiana.
