Report of the County Board of the County of Kandiyohi, State of Minnesota, of Uncollected and Cancelled Personal Property Taxes for the Year 1919.

Be It Known, That the County Board of Kandiyohi County, Minnesota, did meet in session on the 13th day of July, 1920, the same being the first session of said Board after the 10th day of June, 1920; that at said session the County Treasurer said County Board did read to said Board the list of uncollected and personal property taxes for the year 1919 together with their certificate thereon as required by law, and that said County Board did consider said list of uncollected taxes, and did cancel such taxes as they are satisfied cannot be collected. That the following is a correct list of the personal property taxes in said County for said year which said Board are satisfied cannot be collected, and so cancelled by said Board, to-wit:

Now THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That unless said petitioners for the repeal of said school district No. 47, do file their petition with the County Auditor within eight days after the date of the adoption of this resolution, the matter will be considered dropped.


