HARDING WILL BE NEXT PRESIDENT

Preus Leads For Governor on Early Returns. Fight For Congress Close

Early returns from cities and towns give Preus a big lead over Shipstead for governor in the state. It will probably require several days until all the precincts are in and the final result will be known.

Harding will be the next president by a large majority, and a Republican congress has been elected.

In North Dakota the indications are favorable to the re-election of Gov. Frazier.

The congressional fight in the Seventh District was the center of interest. The following is the vote as it stood this evening with 56 precincts missing. It is doubtful if these precincts (as shown in the table in parentheses) will be able to overcome the lead of Volstead.

Rev. Kvale made a heroic fight, but the great amount of money spent and number of speakers sent in to defeat him was too great a handicap to overcome. Rev. Kvale said this evening: "We will keep up the fight."
