DROPPING OFF IN LIVE STOCK RUNS

Trade Pulse Nervous at Week's Opening. Cattle Steady to Lower. Sheep Firm

(By U. S. Bureau of Markets and Minn. Dept. of Agriculture)

Monday's Opening: South St. Paul, Minn., Mar. 21, 1921: Cattle 2,200. Market steady to lower. Calves 800. Market steady, top \$9. Hogs 6,500. Market uneven, averaging 50 and 75c higher. Range \$8 and \$11, bulk \$9.50 and \$10.75. Pigs higher, bulk better grades \$11.75 and \$12. Sheep 3,000. Market strong. Top lambs \$9.75. Top ewes \$6.

General movement of live stock to the seven central markets at the week's opening fell off sharply compared with last Monday, totals being 38,000 cattle, 57,000 hogs and 49,000 sheep against 61,900 cattle, 106,000 hogs and 70,000 sheep a week ago. Many live stock producers are probably holding off shipping in order to await the outcome of the conference at Washington this week relative to the packing house labor situation having been so counseled by their representatives at leading markets in whose opinion general conditions underlying live stock markets at the present time are healthy. Most men in the trade hold the opinion that producers are wise in withholding shipments during the present unsettled period, which will probably be of only short duration.

The local market had about a normal run of cattle Monday and trade opened on a steady to 25c lower basis. Closing trade was a little firmer in line with conditions at outside points. Feeder buyers paid up as high as \$9.25 last week for steers on the beef order, but best here today to killers were some medium grades that brought \$8.50, with bulk of common and medium steers at \$7.75 to \$7.75. Best stock here sold from \$6.75 to \$7.50, with most sales at \$4.50 to \$6.50. Canners and cutters continue at \$2.50 and \$4. Veals opened steady with best at \$9. Heavy feeders sold at \$8.50 and \$8.65 and these sales were about steady, but common and medium grades were slow and weak to
