 In a formal statement, the president asked that contributions be made at once for use by the Red Cross in Pueblo and surrounding territory. The appeal follows:
 To the people of the United States:
 "Overwhelming disaster has come to the people of Pueblo and surrounding districts. Realization of their sufferings now, and in the days to come, prompts me to issue an urgent request to all whose sympathies are awakened to assist the labors of the American Red Cross. Contributions may be sent at once thru the office of any chapter, or directly to Red Cross headquarters at Washington."
