EXAMINATION FOR POSTMASTERSHIP

Competitors Will Be Rated Upon Their Education, Training and Business Efficiency

The United States Civil Service Commission at the request of the Postmaster General, announces a competitive examination for postmaster in the city of Willmar.

This examination is held under the President's Order of May 10, 1921, and not under the civil service act and rules.

To be eligible for consideration a person must be a citizen of the United States, in good physical condition, within the prescribed age limits, and must reside within the delivery of this post office.

Applications must be properly executed on Form 2241, and filed with the Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., prior to the hour of closing business on August 12, 1921.

MILITARY BURIAL IN TOWN OF COLFAX

Remains of Lewis Larson Arrived From France and Were Given Due Honors

The first military funeral to be held in the Town of Colfax was that of the late Private Lewis Larson which was held last Sunday.

Private, Lewis Larson entered the service at Willmar June 24, 1918, leaving with a contingent for Camp Grant, Ill. On August 24 that year he left for Camp Mills, Long Island, N. Y.
