Berkeley, Cal., Oct. 31.—A Minnesota boy was carried off the football field today at the University of California with a broken leg, shattering his hopes of making a fresh numeral this fall. The unfortunate player was Russell Hegness of Willmar, Minn.

Hegness, star end on the freshmen eleven and banked on to win a varsity berth next fall, was injured when he broke up an end run. He was pinned under the interference and a heavy lineman fell on his leg, breaking it.

Coming here with a reputation of being a star on Willmar high school for four seasons, Hegness soon jumped into the limelight. He is considered one of the most likely looking freshmen in years. He was captain of the Willmar high school football team in 1921.—Minneapolis Journal, Oct. 31.
