

Certificate of Organization of the Brown County Bank of New Ulm, Minn.

Know all men by these Presents: That we the undersigned, whose names are hereunto subscribed, have agreed to and do hereby associate ourselves together as a banking corporation, under and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter thirty-three (33) of the General Statutes of the State of Minnesota, and subsequent amendments thereto, and to that end do hereby certify under our hands and seals to the following articles of incorporation, to-wit:—

First.—The name to be distinguished in this bank or corporation and to be used in all its dealings, is the "Brown County Bank."

Second.—The place of business of this corporation and where it will receive deposits and make discount, is the city of New Ulm, in the county of Brown, and State of Minnesota.

Third.—The amount of the capital stock of this association shall be Fifty Thousand (\$50,000) Dollars, and the same shall be divided into five hundred (500) shares of one hundred (\$100) Dollars each. The amount of the capital stock may be increased from time to time by the vote, in favor of such increase, of the holders of at least a majority of the shares of stock previously issued; but the total amount of the capital stock so increased shall not exceed the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) Dollars.

Sixth.—The board of directors of this association shall consist of seven stockholders, and the following persons, Jos. Bobleter, Charles Wagner, E. G. Koch, C. H. Ross, Peter Scherer, Chas. L. Ross, and W. F. Seiter, are hereby appointed directors of this association, to hold their offices as such until the regular annual election takes place pursuant to the by-laws of this bank, and until their successors are chosen and qualified.


