Bicycle Races.

Bicycle races will afford a special attraction at the County Fair next Saturday afternoon. The following are the different events:

First event, half-mile open: 1st prize, \$10 gold medal; 2nd prize, cutting pneumatic saddle; 3rd prize, globe vapor lamp.

Second event, two mile handicap: 1st prize, \$15 gold medal; 2nd prize, one pair of Vim racing tires; 3rd prize, tally-ho cycle lamp; 4th prize, one American 10,000 mile cyclometer.

Third event, Brown Co. championship: 1st prize, \$18 gold medal; 2nd prize, one Brooks seat spring post; 3rd prize, one Standard 10,000 mile cyclometer.

Fourth event, one mile open: 1st prize, \$12 gold medal; 2nd prize, one pair of Morgan & Wright tires; 3rd prize, an Alladin cycle lamp.

Fifth event, 5 mile handicap: 1st prize, \$15 gold medal; 2nd prize, a pair of leather tires; 3rd prize, a search-light cycle lamp; 4th prize, a United States Cyclometer.

A number of the best riders in the State will be here. Also all of the fast riders of Brown County.

"Sound Money" Talk.

The Non-Partisan Sound Money Club held another meeting at Union Hall Saturday evening and listened to speeches on the money question by Dr. Hahn, Theo. Sanders and Mr. Tittman, all of St. Paul. Dr. Hahn and Mr. Sander spoke in German while the other gentleman made a decidedly lame address in English. Notwithstanding the fact that the band was employed to draw out the crowd there were less than 275 people in the hall by actual count. Those who were present did not enthuse to any great extent over the speeches that were made, and many of them were free to admit that more silver votes were made than might be desired.

The Pioneer Press had a special correspondent here, J. S. Vandiver, and he of course sent in a glowing account. He said it was a great demonstration. He said that 500 people were present; that the club would soon have 600 members in New Ulm; that half of the Democrats of the county would vote for McKinley; and that Lind would neither carry the city nor the county, according to the estimates of local leaders. Now if the Press reports of McKinley organizations in other towns are only in keeping with the one given of the New Ulm meeting, Bryan will sweep the state with a landslide.

Democratic County Convention.

A Democratic county convention will be held at New Ulm in the old court house on Saturday, September 19th, 1896, at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following positions: Representative, auditor, treasurer, register of deeds, sheriff, judge of probate, attorney, superintendent of schools, surveyor, coroner, court commissioner and one county commissioner each for the 1st, 3rd and 5th districts. Also to elect a new Democratic county committee and trans-act such other business as may come before the convention. The basis of representation from each election district will be one at large and one for every 25 votes and major fraction thereof cast for Grover Cleveland in 1892. The primaries will be held on Thursday evening, Sept. 17th, from 7 to 9 o'clock.

The Democratic voters of the several election districts will meet at the places and elect the number of delegates set opposite the respective election districts as follows: First Ward, New Ulm, old court house, 8; Second Ward, New Ulm, Union Hall, 7; Third Ward, New Ulm, Casellian Hall, 7; Sleepy Eye, electric light building, 7; Springfield, Council room, 5; Allin, Max Hoffman's, 2; Bashaw, John Roiger's, 2; Burnstown, J.B. Augustines, 2; Cottonwood, Frank Schmelz's, 4; Eden, Julius Honl's, 3; Home, Frank Tattle's, 4; Lake Hanska, Anton Liel's, 2; Leavenworth, John Huiras, 3; Linden, 2; Milford, Wm. Skinner's, 4; Mulligan, Anton Schmid's, 2; North Star, Thos. Schilling's, 2; Prairieville, Peter Mertz's, 2; Sigel, John Kral's, 3; Stark, Geo. Stelzer's, 3; Stately, M. Eckert's, 2.

Peoples Party Convention and Primaries.

A Peoples Party Convention for the County of Brown, Minnesota, will be held on Saturday, the 19th day of September, 1896, at Turner Hall in the City of New Ulm, at 1:30 P. M., for the purpose of putting in nomination county officers as follows: Representative, County Auditor, Treasurer, Sheriff, Register of Deeds, Judge of Probate, County Attorney, Surveyor, Superintendent of Schools, Coroner, Court Commissioner and County Commissioners for the 1st, 3d and 5th District; also to transact any other business which may lawfully come before the convention. All voters, without regard to past political affiliations, who believe in the principles of the Peoples Party, and who desire its success in the present campaign, are invited to participate in the selection of delegates to this convention. The basis of representation shall be one delegate at large for each voting precinct in the county and one for each 25 votes or major fraction thereof cast for S. M. Owen for governor in 1894.
