### Articles of Incorporation

"JOHN HAUENSTEIN BREWING COMPANY.

NEW ULM, MINNESOTA.

Know all men by these presents, that the undersigned do hereby associate ourselves for the purpose of organizing a corporation under and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter Eleven (II) of the General Laws of 1873 of the State of Minnesota, and the several acts amendatory thereof, and to that end adopt and sign the following articles of incorporation:

Article 1. The name of this corporation shall be "John Hauenstein Brewing Company." Article 2.

Article 2.

The general nature of the business of said corporation and the purpose for which the same is established shall be the manufacture of malt, lager beer, ale, porter and other malt liquors, the sale of such articles so manufactured by it and the owning, maintaining and operating of such breweries and other properties as may be necessary to the proper carrying on of a manufacturing business; and the functions of said corporation shall be limited to the business of manufacturing and to business essential thereto.

Article 2.

The principal place of transacting the business of said corporation shall be the City of New Ulun, in the County of Brown and State of Minnesota.

The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the first day of March, A. D. 1900, and the period of continuance thereof shall be for thirty years from said date.

The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be one hundred thousand (100,000.) dollars, of which amount Fifty-thousand (50,000) dollars thereof shall be actually paid in at the time of the commencement of this corporation, and the remainder of said stock shall be issued in such amounts, paid in at such times and places and in such manner as may be determined by the Board of Directors of this corporation.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation shall at any time be subject, shall be the sum of Thirty thousand (30,000) Dollars,

The number of shares owned by each stockholder is as follows: John Hauenstein, 180 shares; Charles Hauenstein, 180 shares; Martin Hose, 180 shares; Fred Seiter 180 shares; and William J. Herian, 18 shares. Article 8.

Article 9.

The stock, property, affairs, business and government of this corporation shall be vested in a board of five (5) directors all of whom shall be stockholders of this corporation. Said Board of Directors of this corporation, after the one herein named, shall be elected from and by the stockholders of this corporation at the annual meeting of said stockholders, which shall be held at the principal place of business of this corporation in said City of New Ulm, at two o'clock p. m. on the third Tuesday of January in each year commencing with the year 1991. Said Board of Directors, except the one herein named, shall be elected for a term of one year and its members shall hold office as such directors until their successors are elected and qualified. At the first meeting of said Board of Directors after such annual election, or at any adjourned meeting thereof, said newly elected Board of Directors shall organize by the election from their own number of a President, Vice

election, or at any adjourned meeting thereof, said newly elected Board of Directors shall organize by the election from their own number of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer of this corporation, who shall hold their respective offices for the term of one year and until their successors are elected and have qualified. Any vacancies in said offices or in said Board of Directors, caused by death, resignation or otherwise, may be filled for the unexpired term by a majority vote of the remaining directors.

At all meetings of said Board of Directors, a majority thereof shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a less number may adjourn from time to time.

The Board of Directors of this corporation shall have power to establish by laws for the management of the affairs of this corporation, create and designate a manager and other officers and employees, and prescribe the powers and duties of each and every officer and employees, and prescribe the powers and duties of each and every officer and employee of this corporation.

D. 1801, with power of filling vacancies provided for herein.


