Hill of Spokane, Wash. came to the city on Monday and placed on record in the Register of Deeds office a deed transferring the property from Hornburg to himself. Bastian for the sum of \$6500 cash and a lot in Spokane, Wash. conservatively estimated to be worth \$1000. Mr. Bastian is the senior member of the well-known firm of Bastian, Marti & Brand and it is expected that they will move their stock of goods into the new store building some time in the spring.




