New Church Completed

Next Sunday, December 7th, will be a red letter day for the Lutheran Emmanuel's Church at Mankato, for on that day their new \$50,000 church edifice will be dedicated with appropriate ceremonies. The building itself without the furnishings costs \$32,000 and was built by Contractor J. B. Nelson of Mankato. Subscriptions aggregating \$5000 have been signed for the new pipe organ which will be installed. If the funds suffice, the tower will be fitted with chimes. The dedicatory services will be in charge of Rev. A. F. Winter, the pastor of the church. Addresses will be delivered by Revs. A. J. Dysterheft, Sanborn; Fr. Randt, Good Thunder; August Bode, Brownston and Prof. A. Ackermann of the Dr. Martin Luther College. Prof. Ackermann will speak in English and the other ministers in German. A special train has been chartered to accommodate the visitors from the west. This train will leave New Ulm at 7:45 a. m. and return leaving Mankato at —. From present indications it is safe to say that there will be a large delegation from this city.

(Continued from front page) would also give the farmers living on the middle road in Milford better travel facilities to New Ulm. By turning south at the Town Hall they would escape the Jeske, Vogelpohl and Cemetery hills.

The expense to the Town of Milford for laying out the proposed town road would be fully \$1500. The Supervisors of the Town feel that they have no authority to expend this amount of money and it is expected that those people who are vitally interested in the road will come to the assistance of the Town in a financial way. The next step will, no doubt, be taken tomorrow, Thursday, December 4th when the County Commissioners will meet in special session. It is expected that at that time the Engineer will be able to report on the estimated cost. If the report is favorable, the County Board will recommend to the State Highway Commission a change in the State Road to Sleepy Eye to include the proposed new road. If favorably acted upon by the Commission,

nothing will stand in the way of having this change in the road made and the necessary petition will be drawn up and circulated.


