ROUMANIA TO KEEP NEUTRAL

Cabinet Decides There is No Reason to Change Course.

London, Oct. 20.—Roumania has no reason which will justify a deviation from the neutral course of the government.

This decision was reached at a cabinet meeting under the presidency of the new king Ferdinand at which were representatives of the various Roumanian parties, says the Vienna Reichpost, according to a dispatch received from Berlin by the Marconi Wireless Telegraph company.

NATIONALISTS INDORSE WAR

Irish Party Adopts Pledge to Fight Until Belgium Regains Freedom.

London, Oct. 20.—Amid tumultuous cheering, with right hands upraised, the Irish Nationalists who crowded Central hall adopted the following pledge introduced by T. P. O'Connor: "We will never sheathe the sword until Belgium has got back her freedom; until every inch of her soil is clear; until a treaty is made not on a scrap of paper, but on foundation behind which stands the millions of the British race."

The meeting was called to express confidence in the leadership of John Redmond and to indorse the action of the Irish party in supporting the war of the allies.

LATEST DEVELOPMENTS IN EUROPE.

That section of Belgium which stretches from Ostend on the North sea to the French border is bearing the brunt of the heavy fighting between the allied army and the Germans.

The invaders have been opposed by the Belgians, who, aided by British warships, according to the French official communication, have succeeded in repulsing their attacks.

The troops who are arrayed against each other between Arras and Roye still are driving with shot and shell, and in this district the allies have advanced at several points.

A Berlin official dispatch announces German forces have reached the neighborhood of Dunkirk.

The German embassy at Washington says that the British battleship Triumph has suffered severely from shell fire from the German fortress of Tsingtau.

Partial Russian successes in fierce fighting in the region of Warsaw and south of Przemysl are reported officially from Petrograd.

CARMAN JURY READY TO HEAR EVIDENCE

Twelve Men Are Selected in Five Hours.

Mineola, N. Y., Oct. 20.—The jury which will determine whether it was Mrs. Florence Conklin Carman, who on June 30, thrust a revolver through a shattered window pane in the office of her husband, Dr. Edwin Carman of Freeport, and shot and killed Mrs. Louise Bailey, was completed in the supreme court of Nassau county here in five hours and twenty minutes.

Never before in the history of this county has a jury in a murder case been selected as quickly.

It was announced that night sessions might be held to complete the case before the end of the week.

Mrs. Carman, about whom District Attorney Lewis J. Smith and his assistants hope to weave a net of circumstantial evidence so strong that a verdict of murder in the first degree will be returned, was in the court room. Grave at times and at others smiling at her husband or her counsel, the wife of the Freeport physician paid close attention to every detail of the proceedings.

Italy Reduces Tax on Grain.

Rome, Oct. 20.—In view of the situation resulting from the war, King Victor Emanuel has signed a decree reducing the import duties on cereals for the period of October 20 to March 21, 1915. The reductions which are based on the quintal, the equivalent of 220.4 pounds avoirdupois, will be as follows: Wheat, from \$1.50 to 60c; corn, 23c to 10c; rye, 90
