COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SPECIAL SESSION.

In the matter of County Ditch No. 20 the engineer and viewers returned their amended reports whereupon the Board did proceed to hear and consider said petition and the matter of establishing and constructing said ditch, and all things pertaining thereto, and did hear all parties interested therein, both for and against the same; and, having duly considered the same, did by resolution duly carried, establish said ditch, and ordered to be constructed, according to the report, plans and specifications thereof made by the engineer and filed herein in said office of the county auditor, and that the report of said viewers thereof and filed herein in said office of the county auditor be and the same are hereby in all things established and confirmed.

A communication from Dr. M. A. Kiefer of Sleepy Eye was read and ordered filed.

The communication from the Tri-State Tel. Co., as read and referred to State Dist. Eng. C. N. Robertson.

The auditor was authorized to issue his warrants in the amount of \$75.00 payable to Jac. Hinderman out of the Co. Road & Bridge Fund for road work done on road leading to the Hinderman bridge as per Com. Palmer's report which was accepted by the Board on Feb. 26th, 1915.

The order from the Judge of Dist. Court in reference to the 8 road appeals was read and ordered filed.

Auctioneer License was granted to A. S. Dorn of New Ulm for one year.

On motion it was resolved that the Auditor write the State Boiler Inspector Thorsen to make a thorough inspection of the courthouse boilers and file his report with the Co. Board at an early date.

Members of Hecker Post, G. A. R. requested an appropriation of \$150.00 for the fitting observance of Memorial Day, and upon motion duly carried, the request was granted.

The report of the Board of Audit was read and ordered recorded in full, to-wit: To the Hon. Board of Co. Com'rs. Brown County, Minn.

D. 1915, for the purpose of examining and auditing the accounts, books and vouchers of Henry J. Kalman & Co. appeared before the Board in regard to the bond issue for the State Rural Highway No. 54, stating technical points which first must be remedied before the bonds could be issued and on motion duly carried, it was decided that the matter be postponed to May 5th, 1915 for final action. The minutes were read and approved and on motion meeting adjourned.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SPECIAL SESSION

The County Commissioners of Brown County, Minn., met pursuant to a special call made by the County Auditor on Saturday, May 1st, 1915 at 10 o'clock A. M.

All members present. The call being read, the Board proceeded to transact all such business as may devolve upon them.

The petition of Chas. Werring XXXX The petition of Chas. H. Werring for a public ditch in the town of Home was taken up and considered and the Board proceeded and did by resolution appoint Carl Case as a competent and experienced engineer to make an accurate survey of the line of said ditch from its source to its outlet as specified and provided for by law, and make his report accordingly. The Board by order appointed Glen Davey, Carl I. Stone and Jos. Martinka as viewers of said ditch. Ferd. Crone, Gust Ottomeyer, A. J. Ochs and A. J. Vogel representing the Brown County Agricultural Association appeared before the Board asking for an appropriation of \$500.00, and by motion duly carried the request was granted, and to be paid when there is money available for that purpose.

The Board of County Commissioners and Auditor from Blue Earth County, together with Dr. A. Schmidt of Mankato appeared before the Board, urging that Brown County join Blue Earth Co., Nicollet Co., Watonwan Co., Le Sueur Co. and 2 other counties to build a joint sanatorium at Mankato providing for the proper care of the tuberculous patients. On motion it was resolved that the Chairman appoint 3 citizens of the county to look into the matter, and that their names are to be presented to Dr. A. Schmidt of Mankato, who is to call a meeting for further discussion on the subject. The Chairman appointed Dr. Geo. B. Weiser of New Ulm, George Glotzbach of Sleepy Eye, A. C. Ochs of Springfield and they are ordered to make their report to the county board of the results.

Pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 16 of Chapter 235 G. L. of 1913, which was revised by the Legislature of 1915. Be it resolved, that Brown County receives a 75 per cent state aid for road and bridge construction or maintenance during the year 1915, and that a copy of the resolutions be submitted to the State Highway Commission.

On motion meeting adjourned to 2 o'clock P. M. this afternoon.

Afternoon Session. The Board met at 2 o'clock P. M. All members present.

Com. Polkow presented a written report of the work done in grading and graveling State Road No. 8, South of Springfield, showing completion of the work thereon according to plans and specifications, together with a XXXXX specifications, together with a certificate of the engineer, C. N. Robertson, at-

tached thereto, in which report a detailed statement is given of the expenses, labor and material contracted for.
