H. S. GROUNDS IMPROVED

The High School Grounds are being improved this week. The work was started last Tuesday morning. Mr. Haerberle has a crew of men filling in

around the building and cutting down the slope along State and Washington streets. When the ridge of the slope has been rounded off and terraced, new sidewalks are to be built. The front walks are to run parallel with the building for a ways and then cut over to the corners; other branches also run from the front of the building to the back entrances, Emerson building, the gymnasium and the engine room. A new driveway is to be built which runs straight out from the engine room. The plans also include a new tennis court, which is to be laid on the north side about where the present driveway is located.

HONOR DR. MAYO, SR.

On May 29th, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the Dr. W. W. Mayo memorial statue will be unveiled at Rochester. Impressive ceremonies are to take place in Mayo Park, and the speakers for the occasion will be Judge C. M. Start of St. Paul, and Bishop O'Gorman of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, both old time friends of Dr. Mayo. There will be songs by children of the city schools, and one of Dr. C. H. Mayo's children will unveil the statue.

The memorial is to be placed near the mound which has been constructed in the northwest corner of Mayo Park.

The statue is of bronze. It is eight feet high, and will rest on a pedestal of Vermont marble six feet in height.

The movement to erect a memorial to Dr. W. W. Mayo was started by citizens of Rochester on November 10, 1911, and the dedication of the statue is of interest here because of the fact that Dr. Mayo was one of the pioneer settlers of this section. For a time he was a resident of Lake Prairie, Nicollet County, and his two famous sons, Dr. Will Mayo and Dr. Charlie Mayo, were born in that township, shortly before the Indian outbreak. In 1862 he began the practice of medicine at Le Sueur, and he and Dr. A. W. Daniels of St. Peter, were two of the surgeons who attended the wounded when New Ulm was besieged by Little Crow and his Sioux.


