**REDWOOD MAN SUCCESSFUL INVENTOR.**

H. C. Bullis left Monday morning for Washington to consult with his attorney concerning the sale of a patent which he has held for over a year and for which he received last week the flattering offer of \$50,000 and royalties. Mr. Bullis' invention is the combination of moving picture films and talking apparatus whereby only one instrument is necessary instead of two and the talking must accord with the picture as the spoken words are run on a film instead of on a record as has been done heretofore. This removes the only objection to the talking pictures and makes them really practical.

Since Mr. Bullis took out the patent for his device he has had many flattering offers, and last week two men from the east, who own several film patents, came to Redwood Falls and made him the \$50,000 offer including a royalty on every foot of film run. If the attorney of Mr. Bullis finds no technicalities in the way, the transfer of the patent rights will be made this week.

Mr. Bullis has been in the employ of the Redwood Power Company for the past several weeks.—Redwood Gazette.

**OCTOBER APPORTIONMENT.**

The October apportionment of the State Aid for schools on the basis of attendance has been made by County Auditor Vogel and warrants will shortly be issued to the different districts. The rate of apportionment this fall is \$3.55 per pupil and as there are 3787 pupils enrolled in the county, the various districts will receive a total of \$13,442.82. New Ulm grabs off the largest amount naturally, and gets \$3,053.00 as there are 860 pupils registered. Sleepy Eye with her 361 pupils comes next for \$1281.55 and Springfield gets \$1164.40 for 328 pupils. The entire list of districts with their attendance and apportionment follows herewith:
