Mr. and Mrs. C. F. Kaiser returned home Monday evening from Bertha, Minn., where they attended the funeral of the latter's sister, Mrs. Ben Bigelow, who passed away at that place last Tuesday morning at 5 o'clock, following an operation for the removal of an abscess. Deceased had been ailing for about a year and was confined to her bed some three weeks prior to her demise. She was born in Chicago, Ill., 58 years ago and came to New Ulm with her parents when but seven years old. About 35 years ago she was married in this city to John Lesemann, who passed away in 1905. They moved to Sleepy Eye some 22 years ago and located on a farm in that vicinity, later taking up their residence at Bertha, where deceased had since made her home. Eight years ago she was married to her surviving husband, aside from whom she leaves six children of her former marriage to mourn her loss: Henry, Arthur, Adolph and Edwin Lesemann and Mrs. Anna Engelking, all residing near Olivia and Miss Hattie Lesemann, who is teaching school at Bertha.
