Preus' Tax Achievement.

The Republican State machine stands upon a shaky leg when it comes to any reduction in taxes for people of the state. Governor Preus in his New Ulm speech Friday evening declared that the people have been relieved of any direct taxes for maintaining the state government. Farmers and business men cannot see any advantage Preus Would Abridge Liberty. in this for their taxes are now heavier than they ever were before.

Having declared that the people were not paying direct taxes for state support, the Governor immediately passes the buck for tax reduction to counties and municipalities which receive direct taxes.

To clear up the Governor's position we quote from the following editorial of the Minnesota Daily Star which analyzes a statement about taxes prepared by the Republican committee:

"Fortunately, the republican state central campaign committee answers the tax question for the voters of Minnesota in a little pamphlet, entitled "About Your Taxes," it is circulating gratis throughout the state. Every voter should get one and read it.

One of the first things that will impress the reader is that, despite the republican campaign statement, the average citizen's total taxes are increasing all the time, and were never higher than now.

all purposes in the state of Minnesota in 1920 was \$116,720,461.03, and in 1921, \$115,818,877.98, and the average rate increased from 52.43 mills to 52.67 mills. The tax levy has increased from \$38,631,288.24 to \$115,-818,877.98 during the 10 years from 1912 to 1922. During this period, according to this booklet, wealth increased 51.28 per cent, and taxes 199.81. Tax Commissioner Armson says the increase was 220 per cent. The owner of a 160-acre farm paid on his holdings in 1912, \$39.91, and in 1922, \$112.14 says the pamphlet.
