### Orleans Couple Held On Serious Charge

Allen and Miss McWain have been under suspicion for some time and officers had been watching the house for Allen's appearance. Both were arrested on warrants issued by State's Attorney Frank D. Thompson and were brought to the Orleans County jail here where they were locked up. Their cases are expected to come up at the September term of Orleans County court. In the meantime they will be held in jail unless they are able to furnish bail.
