SECOND PERIOD

Robb started the scoring again in the second period when he shot a lightning toss into the rim.

Burch heaved a pass to Fisk, who was uncovered, and the latter scored. Lyons, the husky left guard from Hardwick, recovered the big ball out of scrimmage and counted another basket unopposed.

Fisk missed a try at the hoop, but Burch followed up the ball and shoved it in. Aggie Coach Burch secured the ball and waiting a moment or two for an opening, shot it suddenly to Fisk, who talked with ease. Campbell aided another shot, followed by a pair of markers from the hands of Marshall. Fisk's score preceded Campbell's lone dash down the floor for the final basket in this period. THIRD PERIOD
