Committee to Plan Details of Old School



Ralph Hamblett, chairman of the school board, expressed himself as not in favor of an outlay of five or six thousand dollars on the building which was to be for temporary use, as a new building was sure to come, and perhaps soon.

Judge Smith said the school board usually agreed on most things but that there was a disagreement on this question among the board. Mr. Hamblett wanted to use the vacant room in the south school building which would only care for one grade.

"My proposition will care for the two grades, some sixty or seventy scholars and give them such requirements as the state board requires. I believe it feasible to use the main hall as an entrance to both the rooms, with separate entrance provided with two stairways to basement toilet, which cannot be too good for the children, and if the building is still to be used for athletic purposes shower baths should be installed also, but I do not say that they should be put in now.

"The present toilet accommodations for whatever purposes, the hall is used for, is disgraceful." A short time ago the floor of the main hall was strengthened by three iron girders, the basement sheathed and the floor cemented and a three battery furnace installed which is now practically as good as new. The lighting space can be carved for, and the necessary fire escapes called for, provided, and still keep within a reasonable outlay.
