Report on Mineral Exhibits.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Oct. 7, '81. To the President and Executive Committee New Mexico Exposition:

The committee appointed to award the premiums upon the mineral exhibits, division A, class 1, beg leave to make the following report: Best collection of specimen ores from any one mining district in New Mexico.

First premium of \$100, awarded to M. W. Bremen, of Silver City, N. M. Collection representing Chloride Mining District, Grant county.

Second premium, representing "New Placers District," Santa Fe county, N. M. Best collection of specimen ores from the Territory at large.

First premium awarded to M. W. Bremen, Silver City, N. M. Collection representing the "76" mine, Grant county, N. M., owned by M. W. Bremen.

SPECIAL PREMIUM. Best exhibit of ores from any States or Territories of the United States or Mexico, premium of \$100 awarded to M. W. Bremen, Silver City, N. M.

The exhibit of Mr. Bremen has proven the greatest attraction at the exposition, a crowd continuously present eager to examine this magnificent display of the mineral wealth of New Mexico as here represented.

As other accounts have already been published (in local papers) it will not be necessary to enter into a detailed description of the cabinet, but we will simply mention the character of the ores, and the counties and districts from which they came.

Silver, sulphides, chlorides, bromides, and native silver from the "76" mine, Chloride district, Grant county, N. M.; nuggets and placer gold from Hillsboro, Dona Ana county, and Pinos Altos, Grant county, N. M.; and Arizona. Copper, malachite, azurite, red black oxide and native from Santa Rita mines, Grant county; also specimens from Clifton and other copper districts in Arizona.

The counties of the Territory of New Mexico here represented are Grant, Dona Ana, Santa Fe, Socorro, Bernalillo, Lincoln, and Valencia. Counties in Arizona: Yavapai, Apache, Gila, Pinal, Graham, Chachise, and Tombstone. The States of Colorado, Nevada, and California, and Chihuahua and Sonora, old Mexico. Mr. Bremen deserves great credit for his energy and judgment in his selection of specimens, a cabinet unexcelled in the United States, showing free specimens of gold, and silver in all its forms.

Over \$20,000,000 is now lying in the United States Treasury waiting for the holders of past due and called bonds to ask for it. Of this amount about \$10,000,000 is for matured bonds, on which interest ceased at various dates from before Jan. 1, 1837, to July 1, 1881. The other \$10,000,000 is for called bonds on which interest will cease Oct. 21, but which, with interest to Oct. 21, will be paid now on presentation.
