A large quantity of bacon has been received here for shipment to Fort Stanton. Mr. Brunswick advertises this morning for fast freight teams, mules or horses to carry it.

Many passengers on yesterday's Pacific express, stoutly averred that New Mexico's Italian climate had been obtained in Greenland, but were charitable enough to suggest that it had happened through mistake perhaps.

The present snow storm extends as far east as La Junta, Colorado. The snow is quite deep on the plains north of this city. Little damage to the large herds of cattle and sheep is feared as the growth of grass is good and stock will be able to obtain plenty of food until the snow melts off again.

Mr. S. G. Van Gilder, a Chicago capitalist, went through to Socorro yesterday on the south-bound train. He is largely interested in mines at the White Oaks, and has come to the Territory to look after their development.

Supt. Booth of the street railway struggled heroically yesterday morning to clear the track of snow and start the cars. But efforts were useless. The snow eddied and whirled, drifted and piled up right in the center of the track.

Yesterday's south bound train was delayed several hours on account of the wreck at wagon mound. The obstruction was caused by one of the cars standing two near the track to admit of the down train passing in safety.

Mr. J. J. Fitzgerald yesterday received a letter from Mr. Adlon, who is building the new foundry in Las Vegas. The letter was written from Albion, Iowa, Mr. Adlon's former home, and he has the people there greatly worked up to the value of New Mexico as a place to emigrate to.

The announcement is made that the Lake Shore Railroad will not attempt to compete in time with the fast train on the Pennsylvania line, but will run its fast express through in twenty-seven hours, and charge a low rate of fare.

Work on the northern end is progressing energetically, and the D. & N. O. will soon be finished to Pueblo. This is the road that we advocate should come through Las Vegas. This town is practically in the route from Pueblo south to a connection with the Denver & Fort Worth in the Panhandle.
