The Mining Outlook in New Mexico.
Within the past sixty days it is safe to say that more capital has been placed in New Mexico mining property than in any six months of its previous history.

Mining operators from the West, from Colorado, and from the Pacific slope, after careful examinations of property have concluded it is worth while to venture heavy investments, and more legitimate enterprises are already on foot than we had any reason to anticipate for this time.

Meantime prospecting is being prosecuted with great energy and not a day passes without its reports of promising finds and rich strikes. Not a peculiar to any particular locality. In Colfax county placer mining has been exceptionally profitable this season, and several companies are pushing the development of lode claims. In La Paz county mines of the precious metals and of coal are opening up finely. In Rio Arriba county some of the best placer and lode claims have been reported of any in the Territory, and miners are flocking in there. In Santa Fe county, the Cerillos, the New and Old Placers districts are all booming along with an immense amount of development work accomplished; the new smelter at Cerillos Station is about ready to start under competent management; the San Pedro and Canon del Agua copper smelter has been constantly running several weeks, turning out over three tons of copper bullion daily; their new silver smelter is about ready to start up and their 40 stamp mill is also nearly or quite ready. Bernalillo and Valencia counties are not developing so rapidly, or, at least, we do not hear so much from them, but there are some first class prospects in both and a good deal of work is being done. Socorro county has more than a score of districts, all of them full of active, energetic miners and with magnificent prospects everywhere. Lincoln county is among the foremost, with its White Oaks district, having one 10-stamp mill in operation, and \$18,000 worth of smelting machinery just installed there; the Vera Cruz district, the Soledad and White Mountain and Bonito, the Henrietas and the Galinas districts, all promising. Dona Ana county is just putting in its own share of the Organ mountains full of prospectors. Last, though not least, comes Grant county where there are more established mines than in any other county, and the output of bullion is regular and very profitable. In all parts of the country the prospects, almost without exception, develop into paying mines, and within the next twelve months, the whole Territory will be a very live industry.

Passing these all in review, however well one may be acquainted, he cannot but be astonished at the rapid progress the Territory is making. As any one may see, the whole Territory, vast in its area, is sharing in the general prosperity. Each section has its special inducements, and the time is ripe for the investment of capital in any one of them. As we have said, mining operators are flocking here, and without exception we see them all planting money here in large sums with full confidence of reaping a golden harvest.
