John Greenleaf Whittier.
Although enjoying a world-wide reputation, both as an author of poetry and prose, Whittier bears his honors with an ease and simplicity that is naturally imparted to his writings, and it is this fact alone which wins for him such unbounded admirers and numberless friends. Whittier resides at the home of George W. Cate, on Friend street, Amesbury, Massachusetts, the name of the street being derived from the presence of the quaint little Quaker or Friend's meeting house where the famous poet regularly attended his worship. At the home of Mr. Cate he occupies two furnished rooms and his mode of daily life can be summed up in three words—simple and unostentatious. His entire time, with the exception of his one hour in the forenoon and one in the afternoon, when at home is devoted to his books, for Whittier is even now, at the age of seventy-four, a great student.

During the intervals mentioned, Whittier can always be found at the postoffice waiting for the mails to open or just across the street at the book store of John F. Johnson, scanning the Boston dailies, his tall, slender, neatly clothed form rendering him the observed of all observers, not only on the part of strangers, but on the part of townspeople, who regard the venerable silver-haired poet with feeling akin to reverence. During the summer months the principal portion of his time is spent at the mountains and seashore, while during the remainder of the year his time is divided between Amesbury and "Oak Knoll," Danvers, Massachusetts. Oak Knoll is a charming little farm house, and is located about one mile east of the Danvers insane asylum; this farm house is owned by distant relatives, who entertain the highest regard for Whittier and who named the place Oak Knoll because of the presence of a massive oak standing in front. Many of the metropolitan papers of late have claimed Danvers as the home of Whittier, but this was a mistake as he lives, is taxed and votes at Amesbury. In politics he is an ardent Republican, having from the first advocated both by voice and pen the cause of the Republican party. His ideal statesman was Charles Sumner whom he simply worshipped. He was likewise an admirer of the late President Garfield, was in full sympathy with all his public acts and has implicit faith in the present administration. Whittier takes great interest in town affairs and can always be found at the autumnal town meeting and usually at the annual town meeting in the spring, not selling at both the adoption of such measures as will reflect credit upon the town he so much admires.—Boston Star.

New Rates in California.
Few of readers appreciate the full significance that circular No. 41 has for St. Louis merchants in regard to California trade. The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railroad management offer them what they never had before in the history of this city, viz: lower rates than Chicago to and from all principal points in California. Present rates, arranged by the southern route, read from St. Louis to San Francisco, Sacramento, Marysville, San Jose, Stockton, Oakland, and Los Angeles, Cal., per 100 lbs: first class, \$4.80; second class, \$3.80; third class, \$3.15; fourth class, \$2.42; class A, \$2.17; class B, \$1.92; class C, \$1.68; class D, \$1.42—ranging from 14 to 8 cents per 100 pounds lower than Chicago rates to same points.
