

ST. ANTHONY'S HOSPITAL.

Not Only a Credit to Bemidji, but the Northwest. There May be Larger Ones, but None more Systematically Arranged.
A Worthy Monument to a Noble Purpose.



The St. Anthony's Hospital is a monument to the skill and enterprise of its founders. It is a growth; no amount of money could create it. It is today a valuable enterprise to the town of Bemidji and a splendid testimonial to the professional skill of its founders. This hospital is under the auspices of the Sisters of St. Benedict, it being a branch of the mother hospital of St. Mary's of Duluth, and there are five other hospitals conducted by the Sisters in other places. This hospital was organized at Bemidji two years ago, on a small scale, renting a few small rooms over a store. They now have the largest hospital in Northwest Minnesota outside of Duluth. The building and grounds are very handsome, indeed, and are estimated at a cost of about \$18,000. It is located on the west bank of Lake Bemidji, overlooking the same. The building is a handsome three-story building, 80x90 feet, with a stone basement, with 60 rooms, including bath rooms, drug room, reception room, operating room and dining room. All are heated by hot water and lighted by electricity. It is very suitably arranged for a hospital, both as to convenience and sanitary conditions. Hundreds of dollars have been spent in making the walls, ceilings and partitions just what hospital requirements exacted and it is very evident that neither pains nor money were spared. Trained and careful nurses are

always on hand, and from three male to six female are constantly employed. The rooms are suitably furnished for hospital occupancy and the wards are arranged in such a manner as to make them second to none in the land. The operating room is said to be the finest in the country. It is lighted from the sides and the top, giving diffused light that lays open every part of the subject under operation. The room is thoroughly cleaned before and after operations without any more difficulty than cleaning a glass bottle. This hospital though not as large as some of the city hospitals is yet large enough to accommodate all probable demands for some years to come. Patients come here from all over the country, as far east as New York, on account of the healthfulness of the atmosphere and the beautiful location. This hospital is truly a credit to the city and country, and all concerned, and it is entitled to the support of everyone and especially the lumbermen should not fail to avail themselves of the protection afforded in the shape of hospital tickets, which are now being sold for only \$3, good for one year. This ticket holder will receive nursing, medicine, and doctors services in case of sickness. No man can afford to be without this protection. Private country and what patients are also received, and terms are reasonable and this institution is of great value to the city and state.
