

### PROCLAMATION.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 143, of the General Laws of the state of Minnesota, for the year 1903, entitled "An Act to provide for the creation and organization of new counties and the government of the same," as amended by Chapter 124, of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1905, which act is entitled "An Act to amend sections two (2) and four (4) of Chapter 143, of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota, providing for the creation and organization of new counties and the government of the same," a petition was filed with the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota, on the 28th day of March, 1902, praying for the creation of a new county out of territory now lying in Beltrami county and the State of Minnesota, to be named Clearwater county, and which territory is described as follows, to-wit:

"Commencing at the point where the town line between townships one hundred and twenty-five (125) and one hundred and twenty-six (126) intersects the boundary line between the Lake and Beltrami Counties, thence south along the range line between ranges thirty-eight (38) and thirty-nine (39) to the township boundary line of Becker County, Minnesota, thence east along the town line between townships one hundred and forty-two (142) and one hundred and forty-three (143) to a point where said township line intersects the western boundary line of Hubbard County, Minnesota, thence north along the range line between ranges thirty-five (35) and thirty-six (36) to the point where said range line intersects the meandered line of the southern shore of Red Lake, in said Beltrami County, thence following the said meandered line around the western shore of said Red Lake to where said meandered line intersects the township line between township one hundred and twenty-five (125) and one hundred and twenty-six (126) and one hundred and twenty-seven (127) to the place of commencement, containing and embracing therein townships one hundred and forty-three (143), one hundred and forty-four (144), one hundred and forty-five (145), one hundred and forty-six (146), one hundred and forty-seven (147), one hundred and forty-eight (148), one hundred and forty-nine (149), one hundred and fifty (150), one hundred and fifty-one (151), and one hundred and fifty-two (152), north of range thirty-six (36), thirty-seven (37), thirty-eight (38), and thirty-nine (39), west of the Fifth Principal Meridian, being in all the thirty (30) townships aforesaid of said Beltrami County, Minnesota.

And that the village of Bagley be the county seat of said proposed county, as named in said petition, and that E. N. Falk, of the town of Copley, J. W. Johnson, of the town of Leon, Knute Nora of the town of Nora, Ben Skousen, of the town of Popple, and John Pursell, of the town of Pine Lake, be and they are, the first Board of County Commissioners of said proposed county. All as provided in said petition.

AND WHEREAS, on the 28th day of May, 1902, said petition was duly considered by the Governor, State Auditor, and Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota, and found and certified to as conforming in all respects to the provisions of sections two (2) and four (4) of Chapter one hundred and forty-three (143) of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1903, as amended by Chapter 124, of the General Laws of said state for the year 1905.

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of said sections two (2) and four (4) of Chapter one hundred and forty-three (143) of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1903, as amended by Chapter 124, of the General Laws of said state for the year 1905, duly issued and published a proclamation, which said proclamation had been duly filed and considered and directed to be filed in the office of the Secretary of State of Clearwater county, and the voters of said Beltrami county at the next general election to be held in said county on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1902, which proclamation was duly filed, recorded and published in accordance with the provisions of the said act of the Legislature.

AND WHEREAS, it appears that the notice of an election, provided by section one hundred and forty-three (143) of the general laws of the state of Minnesota for the year 1903, as amended by Chapter 124, of the general laws of the state of Minnesota for the year 1905, do hereby publish, declare and proclaim that the proposition to organize and create the said county of Clearwater did receive at the said election a majority of the votes cast thereupon and that the said proposition was duly adopted, and that the county of Clearwater as hereinbefore bounded and described, with the county seat located and the County Commissioners named as set forth in said petition, and proclamation, has been duly created and organized and vested with all the rights and privileges conferred by law upon an organized county of the state of Minnesota.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota, to be hereunto affixed at the Capitol, in the City of St. Paul, in said state, on this 20th day of December, A. D. 1902.
