#### FINED FIFTY DOLLARS.

**Moose Is Killed by a Party of Glasston Men.**

Grand Forks, N. D., May 16.—State Game Warden Hale has just secured the punishment of a resident of Pembina county for killing a moose. The animal crossed the railroad track ten days ago about a mile north of Glasston and was pursued by a party of Glasston men. It was killed next morning by Rudolph Raders about five miles from Glasston and the carcass was divided. Hale was informed of the facts and caused the arrest of Raders, who entered a plea of guilty and was fined \$40 and costs. The moose is supposed to have strayed from Roseau county.

#### PEDDLER IS RELEASED.

**Court's Action Seems to Indicate the License Law Invalid.**

Sioux Falls, S. D., May 16.—James Watson, who was arrested in this city a short time ago on the charge of having peddled without securing a license as required by the new peddlers' license law, has secured his release through habeas corpus proceedings. Watson was convicted in the justice court. He appealed to the state circuit court and was released by Judge Jones on a writ of habeas corpus. While Judge Jones did not specifically rule against the new law, it is claimed that his action indicates that the law is invalid.

#### POSTOFFICE BLOWN UP.

**Several Cans of Powder Were in the Store.**

Mediapolis, Iowa, May 16.—The postoffice at Kosuth, two miles north of here, was blown up shortly after 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon and Postmaster Hodges was killed, his body being torn to pieces. No one was in the building at the time except the unfortunate postmaster. The building was rent and torn and quickly caught fire, soon burning to the ground. Several cans of powder were in the store, but how it became ignited is a mystery.

#### POSED AS A MUTE.

**Demming Is Now Suspected of Burglarizing a Store.**

Sioux Falls, S. D., May 16.—A man who gives his name as Berry J. Demming has been arrested and lodged in the county jail in this city on the charge of having burglarized the French jewelry store at Dell Rapids a few nights ago. It is said some of the stolen property was found in his possession. The day before the robbery Demming visited Dell Rapids, posing as a mute, and begged from the citizens.

#### SHOT HIM DEAD.

**Meade Sought to Thwart the Plans of Two Holdups.**

Muscatine, Iowa, May 16.—An attempt to hold up Thomas McCarthy's restaurant at West Liberty early yesterday morning resulted in the death of Arthur Meade, who attempted to assist the proprietor. When the two robbers entered McCarthy and his partner were compelled to raise their hands. Meade attempted to aid them and was shot dead. The robbers then escaped on a north-bound train.

#### RIOTS IN OMAHA.

**Labor Conditions Cause Feeling of Great Unrest.**

Omaha, May 16.—Labor conditions in this city have grown very strained during the past twenty-four hours and a feeling of anxiety over what may occur to-day is felt by all classes of people. During the day yesterday there were a number of small riots in which no less than four men have been injured. Half a dozen arrests have been made and there is a feeling of unrest.

#### Offers to Build Hospital.

non A. Wright has offered to donate Fergus Falls, Minn., May 16.—Ver- \$15,000 to \$20,000 for the establishment of a general hospital in this city, the building to be erected in memory of his father the late George H.

Wright. The latter was the rear founder of Fergus Falls, and contributed more than any other man to its growth and upbuilding in the early '70s.

#### Sentenced for Forgery.

Glencoe, Minn., May 16.—Ralph Keeley, who has been in the county jail for the past month on the charge of forgery against the state Farmers' Mutual Hail Insurance Company of Waseca, came before the judge of the district court and pleaded guilty to forgery in the second degree. Judge Caldwell gave him a reformatory sentence.

#### MABINI IS DEAD.

**Formerly a Prominent Member of the Filipino Government.**

Manila, May 16.—Mabini, the former minister of foreign affairs of the Filipino government, died from cholera last midnight. He was attacked with the disease on Tuesday. Since his return from Guam, Mabini had lived in seclusion. Captured correspondence of the Rizal province insurgents showed he had been in communication with them, but the letters were not of a seditious nature. The Filipinos and Americans generally regret the death of Mabini, but there will be no demonstration at his burial on account of the nature of the disease.
